KOI DRAGON: In Japanese folklore, the Koi fish represents the overcoming of obstacles. The fish travels up the yellow river and when it comes to the end it transforms itself into a dragon, thus fulfilling its own destiny by overcoming the adversity of the raging river.
100 percent combed ring-spun cotton



ZEN: In Japan, the tiger is emblematic of the great aristocratic warriors known as the Samurai. The tiger represents the virtue of courage. It also means revision, improvement and change. Made of ultra-soft, combed ring-spun cotton.



RYUU: Legend has it that Fudo had to fight the representative of a different religion. He changed himself into a flaming sword but the opponent did the same and the fighting went on without a winner. Now Fudo changed himself into the Dragon Kurikara, wound himself around the opposing sword and started eating it from the top. Ultra soft, lightweight cotton.



SHISHI (or Jishi): Is translated as “lion” but can also refer to a deer or dog with magical properties and the power to repel evil spirits. The shirt is lightweight, made of 100 percent combed ring-spun cotton.



GEISHA: Traditional Japanese female entertainers, Geisha are skilled at classical music and dance. They represent peace and serenity. Made of lightweight, soft combed ring-spun cotton.



FUDO: The Buddhist divinity of wisdom and fire. He is the principal deity of the Myo-o, or great kings. Fudo is often called upon for protection during dangerous times. The shirt is lightweight, soft combined ring-spun cotton.
